Thank-You Breakfast Held at Pond Home for First Responders and DPW

Wrentham, MA—On January 15 Pond Home held a breakfast for members of Wrentham’s Police and Fire Departments and the Department of Public Works, to thank them for the outstanding job they did last month during the sinkhole incident which closed a portion of Rt. 140 for several hours.

On Monday, December 1, 2014, a car struck a fire hydrant in front of Pond Home, causing a water main break, street flooding and a gaping 20-foot sinkhole. Emergency crews closed the road and water was shut off to the neighborhood. A shelter-in-place order stayed in effect until it was verified that there was no gas leak. Crews worked through the night to repair the water main and fill the sinkhole. The road reopened the following morning.

“We are so grateful to our first responders and the DPW for keeping all of our residents and staff safe through this ordeal, said Rebecca Annis, Administrator of Pond Home. “They worked through the night and problem solved with our residents’ best interests in mind. This breakfast is our way of saying thank you and giving our residents a chance to thank the town employees who support them.”
