Wednesday 7/3: Wear red, white and blue



This month's resident spotlight is our own **Kathleen Gookin**. Kathleen grew up in West Roxbury, MA. She was an only child until she was nine years old and welcomed her new brother into the family. She reports that she "idolized" him as did her parents.

Her paternal grandmother was born in County Cork, Ireland. She was one of eight children, an Irish Brood! Tragically, her husband (Kathleen's grandfather) fell off a roof while working and broke his hip. He was unable to be fully functional because of this accident. However, his wife (Kathleen's grandmother) was a strong woman. She raised eight children, and

Kathleen remembers her love for lilacs that adorned her garden. Kathleen still shares her grandmother's love for lilacs.

Kathleen speaks of the Irish propensity for choosing favorites among family members. She discusses how her father's sister (her aunt) was the chosen favorite of her grandfather (her father's father). The family was heartbroken when she died of Diphtheria at the age of 17.

Despite the difficulties that her ancestors suffered, Kathleen's father went to Harvard University. He taught Latin and became the Vice Principal of Charlestown High School.

After Kathleen was married, she lived in Gloucester where she raised her daughter Diane. She vividly remembers their turquoise roof. Her husband was a Marine in the Korean War. He later worked for Western Electric in Watertown as an Engineer. Kathleen worked for IBM for twelve years as a Keypunch Operator in Needham before she had her daughter.

She is a grandmother to two babies, ages one and two.

Kathleen still wears the map of Ireland on her face and in her demeanor.
