To My Dear Residents:

I am sure many of you heard about the Fall River, MA Assisted Living facility that experienced the fire earlier this month. It resulted in 10 resident deaths and many injuries. Our hearts go out to all those affected by this tragic event. Facilities Manager, Josh Sampson's family, experienced a loss in this tragedy, his uncle passed away. This serves as a powerful reminder of how critical fire safety is in any care environment, and we want to reassure you that the safety and well-being of our residents and staff remains a high priority.

Of course, none of us want to experience a fire at Pond Home. I want to make you aware of all that is in place to help protect everyone who lives, works, and visits here, if one was to occur.

- **Fire Drills:** We hold monthly fire drills, live and observed by Wrentham Fire Department during daytime drills, and silent during evening and overnight hours. During live drills, the many fire doors are checked to make certain they close properly. These drills are done to make sure staff are comfortable and ready to respond if a fire/smoke were to be discovered.
- **Fire Detection and Alarm Systems:** All fire alarms and smoke detectors are tested on a quarterly basis. We contract with Johnson Controls for this service. Our alarm systems are directly connected to the Wrentham fire department for the quickest response possible. There is a central panel that monitors the detection system.
- **Sprinkler and Suppression Systems:** Pond Home is a fully sprinklered building. We utilize a wet system in all interior spaces and a dry system in the attics and exterior porches. We contract Johnson Controls to test these systems quarterly and keep us up to date so the sprinklers would activate if needed. The building is compartmentalized, with fire doors that break the building into protective areas, so that evacuation, and all its potential trauma and added challenges, is our last resort.
- **Fire Safety Training:** All employees are trained on fire safety protocols specific to Pond Home at orientation and annually. We are scheduling further training sessions now, in response to this sad tragedy, so all employees feel more confident in their role.
- **Inspections:** Pond Home is routinely inspected by fire safety authorities and the DPH to ensure compliance with all regulations. Wrentham Fire Department inspects us quarterly; we have an annual MA Department of Public Safety inspection and perform quarterly safety inspections in the building as part of our Quality Assurance Committee.

What can you do to help keep us safe from fire?

- Read the fire plan on the back of your room door to be aware of your responsibility if a fire alarm goes off. Unless you are in a room with a fire, your responsibility is to remain in your room with the door closed, awaiting direction from staff.
- Pond Home is a smoke free community. Please do not smoke on our property. Employees have a single designated area to smoke with a safety ashcan provided.

Pond Home is a long-standing member of MassMAP. MassMAP (<u>Massachusetts Long Term Care Mutual Aid Plan</u>) is a program designed to help long-term care facilities in Massachusetts prepare for and respond to disasters. It facilitates cooperation and mutual aid among facilities like nursing homes, assisted living residences, and rest homes. MassMAP provides resources, training, and a web-based system for emergency planning and response. We actively participate in their annual drills and training sessions to remain up to date.

Be comforted by knowing we are a compartmentalized building. This means that fire doors close automatically when an alarm sounds and creates barriers for any fire or smoke to get into other sections of the building.

May we all continue to enjoy safe living and working at Pond Home for years to come. Thanks for reading!
